WHAT DOES THE COURSE OFFER?

This course is designed to assist researchers in complex, remote or hazardous environments, both for those working within their home country and for foreigners.

- (b) a review of specific fieldwork-related risks and actions designed to preventative measures;
- (c) on preparedness and contingency planning so the researcher knows what to do if the risks manifest.
